EXPENSES

The delegates are expected to pay for their own international travel and accommodation. The Ministry of Environment and Tourism of Mongolia will cover meals and transport for the field trips within the country.

CURRENCY

The currency of Mongolia is *Tugrik*. The exchange rate of the Bank of Mongolia as of 30thOctober 2016

Exchange rate of 1 USD vary between 2200-2230 tugriks

All the major international cards are accepted at major hotels & department stores. Mongolian tugrugs will be needed in cash at smaller shops.

INTERPRETATION/ WORKING LANGUAGE

The working languages of the meetings and field trips are English

FOOD/HEALTH

The extreme <u>continental climate</u> has affected the traditional diet, so the Mongolian cuisine primarily consists of <u>dairy products</u>, <u>meat</u>, and animal fats. Use of <u>vegetables</u> and <u>spices</u> are limited. Local food will be provided during the field trip. Mongolian meals are mostly made of beef and mutton and flour.

We advise you to bring your own medicines in case temporary change of regular water or food may cause some minor discomfort.

TIME ZONE

The time in Mongolia is GMT+08.00 hours.

ELECTRICITY

220 Volts. Generally 2 pin electrical plug is in Mongolia. 3 pin electrical plugs are available at the hotels.

WEATHER

Mongolia has a continental dry climate. Weather in late October is very changeable from morning to night. The average temperature in Ulaanbaatar in October is slightly cold at -1.1 °C (30.02F). Overnight temperatures are generally cold with an average low of -6 °C (21.2 °F). There could be some stormy and windy days. We advise delegates to take with them warm clothes and comfortable hiking shoes for field trip.
